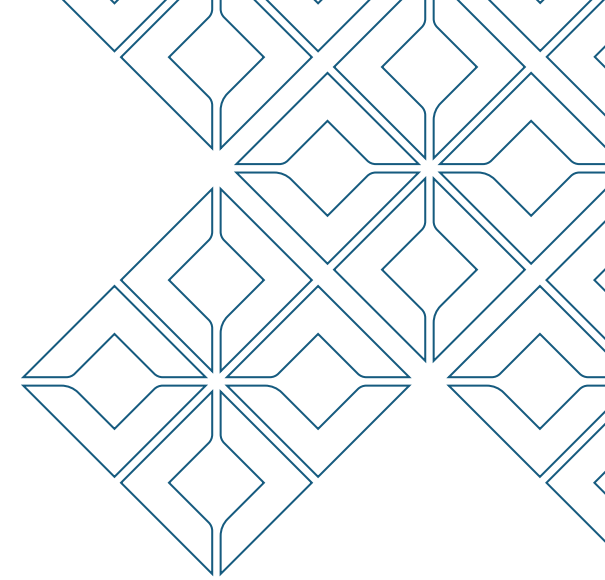


6 success factors for Supply Chain integration
